### How did you find out about Choose Respect?

I first learnt about the Choose Respect initiative last year when I attended its launch at Carey Park Primary School.

Over the years I have regularly been asked the question, 'What can we do?' when confronted with anti-social problems in our community.

Hearing about Choose Respect I felt this could be an answer to that question.

I then sponsored Gary Butcher to come to Bunbury to hold the first Choose Respect information forum in March 2008, and have continued to work with Gary and our community.

I have closely followed the progress of the initiative and am heartened by the results and the speed at which the message has started to spread.

### What do you believe are the strengths of the Choose Respect initiative?

As we have seen in Bunbury, the Choose Respect message can be spread and embraced not only in schools but also in sporting clubs and the wider

community. Choose Respect is not a program with a beginning and end, but an ongoing initiative aimed at fostering a culture of respect for ourselves, other people and our surroundings. It is not a bandaid solution for the problems in our community, but aims to create a generational change.

### Why would you encourage the citizens of Bunbury to consider becoming Choose Respect champions?

Every person who embraces Choose Respect is taking a step in the journey towards creating a more caring culture in our community, a return to old-fashioned values and a safer future.
